

IELTS Preparation course and practice test 1



The Net Languages IELTS Preparation Course follows closely the structure of the actual IELTS exam. The course consists of six modules: introduction, listening, reading, writing, speaking and, finally, a complete practice test. The practice test is self-marking in the listening and reading sections and tutor-graded in the writing and speaking sections. This includes a variety of different reading and listening texts, and extensive use of videoclips of sample interviews from the speaking test.
