


The "Digital Written Correspondence" module contains six sections, 6 practice sections and a final test. You will improve your grammar and writing skills in a higher education context.








Section 1: Tense review



In this section you will review verb tenses.




Section 2: Cause and result

Section 3: Purpose




In this section you will practise expressing purpose using to, in order to, and so that.

Practice 3 This section practises what you have studied in section 3, "Purpose".




Section 4: Reporting verbs

Section 5: Passive review




In this section you will review syntax and passive verb forms.
