GRAMMAR

Present simple vs. present continuous

Use the **present simple** to talk about habits and facts – things that are permanent. I **live** in London.

I **speak** two languages.

Use the **present continuous** to talk about changing situations – things that are temporary.

I'm studying Italian at night school.

Sheila's watching a movie.

Say and tell

Immediately after tell we say who is spoken to.

James told Mary that he was leaving.

Tell me what you want to do.

After say we don't have to put who is spoken to.

Can you say that again, please?

Did you **say** something?

She said to John that she would go.

NOT: She said John that she would go.
