Why do you live in Manchester? > Because I work there.

Adverbs of frequency

Usually and *never* are adverbs of frequency. They tell us how often an action happens.

Astronauts **usually** work for about 16 hours a day.

Space shuttle crews are **usually** in space for about two or three weeks.

Food doesn't usually need preparation.

Astronauts **never** have a shower in space.

Adverbs of frequency go before all verbs, except the verb be.

I **often** <u>read</u> at night.

I am often in the office until late.

More adverbs of frequency

always - usually - sometimes - often - sometimes - hardly ever - never 100%------0%

USEFUL PHRASES

Asking for travel information

Agent: Hi. How can I help you?

YOU: When does first bus leave for London?

Agent: At half past six.

YOU: Oh, that's too early. When does the next bus go?

Agent: At 7:30. Then there's a bus every hour.

YOU: Right. When does it arrive?

Agent: At about 10:30. The journey takes about three hours.

YOU: When does the last bus return to Cambridge?

Agent: At 10:30 in the evening. **YOU:** How much does it cost?

Agent: It's £12.50 single and £18.50 return.
