## Verb patterns: give

Give is a verb that usually goes with the pattern **verb** + **noun** + **noun**.

Give me the brush.
I'll give you a call.

Give also takes the pattern **verb** + **noun** + *to* + **noun**: **Give** the book to Sandra.

A: What's that?

B: I don't know. Somebody gave it to me.

## Can for requests

Can you help me?

Can you open the door?

#### **Pronouns**

I love her.

She loves me. (subject + verb + object)

*I* and *she* are subject pronouns. *Me* and *her* are object pronouns.
