<b>Who</b> is that man?	>	I think he's John's brother.
<b>How</b> are you?	>	I'm fine, thanks.
<b>Why</b> do you live in Manchester?	>	Because I work there.

## Question word order

(Question word) + auxiliary verb + subject + verb in the infinitive

Where does she live?

How do you move in the spacecraft?

Can you speak to your family?

Do you listen to music?

## Adverbs of frequency

*Usually* and *never* are adverbs of frequency. They tell us how often an action happens.

Astronauts **usually** work for about 16 hours a day.

Space shuttle crews are **usually** in space for about two or three weeks.

Food doesn't **usually** need preparation.

Astronauts **never** have a shower in space.

Adverbs of frequency go before all verbs, except the verb *be*.

I **often** read at night.

I am **often** in the office until late.

## USEFUL PHRASES

### Asking for travel information

**Agent:** Hi. How can I help you?

**YOU:** When does first bus leave for London?

**Agent:** At half past six.

**YOU:** Oh, that's too early. When does the next bus go?

**Agent:** At 7:30. Then there's a bus every hour.

**YOU:** Right. When does it arrive?

**Agent:** At about 10:30. The journey takes about three hours.

**YOU:** When does the last bus return to Cambridge?

**Agent:** At 10:30 in the evening.

**YOU:** How much does it cost?

**Agent:** It's £12.50 single and £18.50 return.
