#### The article the

We use *the* to refer to certain geographical features by name. deserts: **the** Sahara Desert rivers: **the** Nile, **the** Thames seas: **the** Mediterranean Sea, **the** Black Sea oceans: **the** Atlantic Ocean, **the** Pacific Ocean

We use *the* to refer to some geographical features in the plural only. Compare: Mount Everest **the** Alps Pitcairn Island **the** Philippines

#### **Future expectation**

We **hope** the weather will be good. (I <u>would like</u> this to happen.) We **expect** to be very tired. (We think this is <u>probable</u>.)

Hope and expect can be followed by the infinitive. I hope to receive an answer from him soon. She expects to get a big present for her birthday.

### Talking about the future

will

We often use *will* to write formally about the future. Anne and Paula **will** take a month to walk across the Kalahari Desert. Any money you donate **will** help us start co-operative work projects.

#### *be* + *going to* + infinitive

We often use *be* + *going to* + **infinitive** to talk informally about a future plan or intention.

I'm going to start doing a lot of exercise. Are you going to take any special equipment with you? We're going to take lots of water.

#### **Present simple**

We often use the present simple to talk about timetables or fixed itineraries. When exactly **do** you **start** your trek? We **leave** on the 1st of June.

What's the hotel like?	It's three-star.
