Prepositions of place

The bed is **opposite** the door.

The sofa is **in** the living room.

The picture is **above** the mantel.

The table is **next to** the window.

The television is in front of the sofa.

There is a night table on the left/right of the bed.

Put the lamp on the table.

There's a rug in the middle of the room.

Put the table **between** the sofa and the armchair.

We put the lamp **behind** the sofa.

Giving advice

One way to give advice is to use the structure: imperative + *or* something *might* or *will/won't* happen.

Call the hotel or they will cancel your reservation. (will for something definite)
Mail that letter today, or it won't arrive on time. (won't for something definite)
Make sure you study before the test, or you might fail. (might for something possible)

Asking for information about a house/apartment Could you tell me about it?

Could you tell me about it?

Where is the apartment?
How many bedrooms are there?
What's the apartment got in it?

When can I come and see it?
What time would be best for you?
